OUR ACCOMPLISHMENT AND ACTIVITIES DURING APRIL 2017 - MARCH 2018

The year 2017-18 has been a year of programmes, progress and achievements for Fransalian Agency for Social Care and Education in India (FAsCE India). Through its Integrated Community Development Programmes, Community Based Rehabilitation for Persons with Disabilities, Promotion of Child Rights, Promotion of Health and Protection of Environment projects and programmes, the organization was able to tread the path of progress. The timely interventions, capacity building programmes and hand-holding support to our beneficiaries are the key factors to our journey of promoting progress in the lives of the poor and marginalized children, youth, women and men. This annual report 2017-18 highlights our major activities undertaken during the review period by the organization in collaboration with our local partners and efficient project teams.

PROMOTION OF CHILD RIGHTS

Focusing on the development and participation of children of the remotest corners of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland and Manipur the programmes have touched 3659 young lives, the direct beneficiaries and influenced hundreds of families and neighbourhoods. During this review period the major programmes were implemented with child-right and child-friendly approach to improve their social position while taking into consideration their evolving capacity and best interests.-

1.1 Child Labour Free Neighbourhood through Education and Community Participation

The sole aim of this project is to eradicate and prevent child labour and dropout of school children. The children between the age group of 6 - 14 years are provided with free tuition classes in the Supplementary Education Centres. Through curriculum based on the syllabus as per the standards the children are motivated and given necessary guidance in their studies for improving their academic performance. Co-curricular activities are also given equal importance in these centres to provide an opportunity to participate in music, dance, sports and art & craft for the all-round development of every child.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

New Supplementary Education Centre at Ekrabari

FAsCE India initiated a new Supplementary Education Centre at Ekrabari village in Panikhaiti area on 12 November 2017. The new Centre was inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Saji George Executive Director of FAsCE India. Initially the classes were held in the open-air at the premises of the village church. There are 110 children enrolled in the centre and five teachers. To provide basic facilities for effective teaching and learning FAsCE India set-up a three room temporary structure for housing the supplementary centre in the village. Now the classes are held inside the classroom, classes are divided into three lower primary, primary and middle sections. Timely educational assistance is provided to the centre for making learning a joyful experience for the children.





New Platform for Children of Narengi Supplementary Education Centre

Children of Narengi Supplementary Education Centre had the opportunity to participate in the two major state level workshops for preparation of Children's Manifesto and an exposure to the Assam Secretariat. In first of its kind programme in whole of North East region and India on planning and preparation of Children's Manifesto two children from FAsCE India Supplementary Education Centre participated in the process of formulation along with the children from the partner organisations from Guwahati, Tezpur, Kokrajhar and Jorhat zone.





Four children from FAsCE Supplementary Education Centre, Narengi along with 100 child representatives from across the state participated in the Interaction Programme held on World Children's Day, November 20, 2017 in the Central Hall of Assam Legislative Assembly.

1.2 Children's Parliament and Children's Club



Children's Clubs are inclusive clubs for holistic development of children that will comprise the concept of children as decision-makers on issues that affect their lives. It is pivotal to ensure inclusiveness and ownership through equal opportunities for all children to participate in their all-roun d development of children living in the remotest parishes of Siang Districts of Arunachal Pradesh. And the Children Parliaments are functioning with their regular monthly activities and skill

development activities in Dhemaji and Karbi Anglong Districts of Assam. The empowerment of children to engage themselves in advocacy role is one of the most effective approaches envisaged through these Children's Parliaments and Children's Clubs. And it has a strong focus on mobilizing children, building their capacity to undertake grassroots and national level advocacy, and play a critical role in removing the barriers that prevent children from enjoying their rights.

1.3 Prevention of Child Abuse and Child Rights Violation

During this reporting period the second phase of this project was being implemented. This project supported by MISSIO Aachen, focused on the capacity building and strengthening of what was established during the first phase for greater sustainability. Strengthening of Child Clubs through training of its leaders, up-



skilling the Counselors' with updated training to improve their performance in the schools and villages, preparing the youth as child protection volunteers, preparation of Child protection Policy to create more visibility as organizations and constant monitoring of Child Right Clubs in the schools to make it a sustainable body in the schools.

Major activities carried out during this phase

Workshop on for Priests and Sisters on Child Abuse and Violation of Child Rights

Two day workshop on Child Abuse and Violation of Child Rights, took off with a short inaugural function on April 1, 2017 at 9 A.M., MSFS Provincialate, Guwahati. Fr. Saji George MSFS, Executive Director, FAsCE India, welcomed the participants 60 MSFS priests and 40 sisters from 45 MSFS centres and schools of Northeast India and the resource person Rev. Fr Christu Das from Social Initiatives for Growth and Networking, Ranchi, Jharkhand. Rev. Dr. George Panthanmackel, Provincial Superior of MSFS Northeast India delivered the keynote address highlighting the significance of the programme in the present scenario.



Child Protection Policy

During the first half of the Second Phase of this project a Committee was set up to discuss the Child Protection Policy for the MSFS Northeast India Province. The committee had several meetings and made study analysis of the situations in the schools and boarding houses run by the MSFS in the region. In the light of the many discussions and deliberations under the guidance of Rev. Fr. Provincial drafted Child Protection Policy along with the Staff Policy and Service Rules for the SFS Schools

fAsCE India, working to ensure and promote Child Rights, believes that the right to education is not only the right to access to education but also the right to receive an education of good quality and





January 2, 2018 was a momentous day in the life of the people of Umwahlang, Meghalaya, as they witnessed the inauguration of the newly constructed boys' hostel to enhance quality education for the tribal children at Umwhalang and its surrounding villages. Most Rev. Dominic Jala, Archbishop of Shillong blessed the new boys' hostel while Rev. Fr George Panthanmackel MSFS, Provincial of MSFS Northeast India Province, inaugurated the same. Fr Saji George, Director of FAsCE

India, expressed his gratitude to Rev. Fr Mathai Ottappallil and Miss Sylvia Prieth for raising the fund for the project and materializing the long awaited dream of the people of Umwahlang. He also expressed his gratitude to Rev. Fr Emmanuel Mappliaparmabil, the Former Executive Director of FAsCE India, for initiating the project and Fr Antony Kattathara for supervising the construction of the same. The hostel has a capacity to accommodate 70 children.

3. INTEGRATED RURAL DEVELOPMENT AND WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

During this annual reporting period four major developmental projects were implemented in Assam, Meghalaya and Manipur. The integrated rural development and women empowerment is not just for meeting the economic needs but it also achieves holistic social development at the five levels of empowerment-organization, education, health, saving & credit and income generation. The SHGs are formed through the implementation of the above mentioned programme stabilized their earning and improve their living conditions. There has been a positive change in the attitude and life perspective of the beneficiaries.






3.2 Integrated Community Development Programme at Manikbond

Integrated Community Development Programme is being implemented by Seva Kendra, the zonal office of FAsCE India at Manikbond in Lowaipoa Block under Karimganj District of Assam. This project is supported by AIFO (Amici Di Raoul

The objective of project is to improve the living condition of poor people effecting a sustainable improvement in Economic standard, Health care facilities, Empowerment of women and Education. 3.3 Formation and Strengthening of Self Help Groups for Improved Livelihood

"Formation and Strengthening of 40 Self Help Groups for Improved Livelihood at Somonpara, West Garo Hills District, Meghalaya" started from 01 February 2016 in the 40 villages of Somonpara has completed two years of implementation. This project is supported by MISEREOR, Hilfswerk, Germany. During the review period the following activities were carried out:



Alternative Employment and Entrepreneurship Skills Training Programme

Cluster wise alternative employment and entrepreneurship skills training programme was held reaching out to 239 members of the SHGs in different trades of income generations. It was organized in clusterwise to ensure good participation and good learning experience of the participants in their own community circles / clusters. The training programmes on income generating activities were on Candle Making, Mushroom Cultivation, Detergent Making and livestock & organic farming.

Exposure and field trip for Self Help Groups

10 SHGs were taken to the Gambegre Block Development office; Poultry farm and Fishery department for an exposure trip to interact with the block office personnel in development activities for the SHGs and information about various Government schemes available for SHGs were gathered.

3.4 Integrated Community Development Programme in Thingba Khunou and Thingba Khullen

This project in Thingbakhullen and Thingbakhonou villages of Senapati Distict of Manipur in its 3rd phase during this review period focused on the major components - Livelihood Initiatives, Vocational Skill Training of Youth & School Dropouts and Supplementary Education Centre.

With the theme "Christian Youth Leadership and Development Programme" under the aegis of Church in Need was held from 8 to 10 December 2017, in the SFS Shrine Hall at MSFS Provincialate premises, Narengi, Guwahati. Around 140 youth from 35 MSFS parishes of North East India participated in this training programme. Fransalian Youth Mission collaborated with Fransalian Agency for Social Care and Education in India [FAsCE India] in organising the programme. The well qualified resource-persons were Government officers and bureaucrats.

HEALTH FACILITATION CENTRE AND TOILET SANITATION FACILITIES AT SOMONPARA

During the baseline survey, it was found that in Somonpara health facilities are deplorable. To address the health issues and problems FAsCE India Governing Board decided to initiate a Community Facilitation Centre with the help of the friends of FAsCE India. Hence, with the health awareness building programme and health concerns with its curative and preventive measures this health facilitation centre is rendering the first aid, supply of medicine and emergency treatments to the





patients who visits the centre. A professional trained nurse is in-charge of this centre. This health facilitation centre of Somonpara is also the referral point of the FAsCE India Health Committees formed during this project period to render services and conduct health programmes. The health care centre serve as tangible signs of social transformation. Sanitation facilities for boys & girls too are initiated at Somonpara and for the health and wellbeing of the children.

importance of healthy food, hand washing and conducted quiz on food and nutrition and the winners were awarded prizes. The programme came to an end with planting of a fruit sapling.

6. World Sight Day

World Sight Day (WSD) is an annual day of awareness held on the second Thursday of October, to focus global attention on blindness and vision impairment. It is the most important advocacy and communications event on the eye health calendar and a great time to engage with the world at large. World Sight Day 2017 was on 12 October 2017. On this occasion FAsCE India head office team along with the FAsCE Self Help Groups and children of FAsCE Supplementary Education Centre, Narengi joined with other NGOs and likeminded people supporting the visually challenged people to spread the message of the need to donate eyes. The project Vision flagged off from Food Villa and had a Blind Walk Rally to Don Bosco School ground, Panbazar, Guwahati.





7. Children's Day Celebration

Children's Day was celebrated in colourful and fun-filled manner in the three FAsCE Supplementary Education Centres at Ekrabari, Bongaon and Narengi and at the community level it was celebrated at Amsing Jorabat and Hatisila in a unique way. Fr. Saji George MSFS, Executive Director; Fr. Clean Arengh MSFS, Associate Director and the head office team of FAsCE India attended the celebrations. At the community level in Amsing Jorabat Children's Day celebration was held on 11 November and in Hatisila it was held on 14 November. And at





the centre level it was held at Ekrabari on 12 November, at Narengi it was held on 18 November and at Bongaon it was held on 19 November. The programmes were marked by variety cultural performances of dance. At the Bongaon and Ekrabari centres the programme consisted of cultural dance items and in Narengi the celebration was marked with cultural dance and a thematic skit on child labour and right to education.

8. National De-worming Day

FAsCE India joined hands with Vitamin Angels to observe the National De-worming Day on February 10, 2018 in Amsing Jorabat and Ekrabari in Guwahati. 120 children within the age of 1-16 years were administered albendazole tablets. Along with albendazole administration, awareness on behavioural changes, cleanliness, hygiene use of toilets, wearing shoes/chappals, washing hands etc. was given to the children and their parents. The objective of the day is to deworm all preschool and school going children between the age of 1-19 years through the platform of schools and Anganwadi centers in order to improve their overall health nutritional status. Deworming removes worms in children, thus offering them a chance to optimal physical and mental development.



9. International Women's Day Celebrated

International Women's Day was celebrated in FAsCE India head office to commemorate the political, social and economic achievements of our 40 Women's Self Help Groups of Guwahati. The Chief Guest of the function was popular Assamese artist Smt. Chetana Das, and among the other special invitees were Rev. Fr. George Panthanmackel, Provincial of MSFS North East India Province, and Rev. Fr. Saji George, Executive Director, FAsCE India During the function Best SHGs were awarded to Asha Self Help Group of Ekrabari and Jyoti Self Help Group of Amsing Jorabat and the awards were given to the groups by Rev. Fr. George Panthanmackel MSFS.





In Thingbakhullen International Women's Day on 5 March 2018 was celebrated with its members of women self help groups. The celebration was marked by colourful cultural programme staged by the SHGs and the women of Thingbakhullen and Thingbakhunou villages of Senapati District in Manipur under the leadership of Sr. Liseena HC, Programme Coordinator.

10. Child Protection Day

Assam has been the first state in India to observe Child Protection day on March 4, 2018, a public function was organised at Lachit Ghat in Fancy Bazar, Guwahati. The central organising committee for this programme was Adolescent and Child Rights Network Assam, FAsCE India, Childline Barpeta and Matri Mandir. Children of FAsCE India Supplementary Education Centre, Narengi staged a street play on child



labour. Shishu Sharoti and MSW students from Tata Institute of Social Sciences had also performed skits on issues of child abuse. A video on Child Abuse and Protection was screened to spread awareness to the audience of about 500 people from different walks of life inviting them to join the campaign for Child Protection and contribute their bit for making a child-friendly society.

Clean Arengh MSFS, Associate Director, Ms. Regina Sereng, Programme Coordinator, Ms. Chaya Kalita Women's Coordinator and Mr. Ajeesh Mathew Accountant the head office team had a day of gratitude and prayer at the Divine Retreat Centre, Khetri.



RESCUE AND REHABILITATION SERVICE

Orphan children living in extreme poverty in Amsing Jorabat were rescued and rehabilitated by FAsCE India. The parents of these children died of tuberculosis, thereafter their paternal uncle took their responsibility, however, due to their poor economic condition they were finding it difficult to raise these children aged ten, six and four. FAsCE India facilitated the process of their rehabilitation at Child Welfare Committee. According to the order of CWC the children were placed in Snehalaya for their care and protection. During the initial six months the children were shifted for much needed medical care to Shantidaan, an institute run by Missionaries of Charity. At present they are in Snehalaya enjoying a normal childhood.



RELIEF SUPPORT DISTRIBUTED TO FLOOD AFFECTED FAMILIES IN GOGAMUKH

Flood relief support was provided by FAsCE India in collaboration with Christ King Parish, Gogamukh to the flood affected families of Bordoibam village under Dhemaji district, Assam. The distribution was held in Bordoibam village on 9 November 2017. According to the survey conducted by the parish there were 88 families suffered the worst during the floods in the month of July. Fr. Cornelius Bara, Parish Priest of Gogamukh parish facilitated the distribution of the relief support. The relief support of blanket to each



family came as a respite, especially at the onset of winter for the people who had lost their homes and all their belongings in the flood.



HOUSING PROJECT AT SILAPATHAR

Fransalian Agency for Social Care and Education in India (FAsCE India) in collaboration with SFS Community at Silapathar, could materialized the long cherished dream of Mr. Gobin Sarkar and his family to have a stable house and land of his own, who has been serving the SFS Mission Centre at Silapathar since 1976. construction of the concrete structure with five simple rooms including a kitchen. The painting, electrical wiring, plumbing and earth filling were done by Mr. Gobin at his expenses. CONSTRUCTION OF COMMUNITY FACILITATION CENTRE AT SILAPATHAR, ASSAM

It will also help FAsCE India to organise its numerous training and capacity building initiatives for its development partners, staff and even other NGOs with whom a strong networking relationship is established.
